


CHAPTERS

Q What is the difference between a chapter and a district?

A Districts are separate legal entities that collect their own membership dues, file their own tax returns, operate under their own bylaws, and maintain their own federal/state exemptions.

Chapters are geographically based, local organizations that fall under the legal umbrella of CVMA. CVMA and its chapters operate as one legal corporation. CVMA collects membership dues for chapters, takes on financial and administrative work for chapters, and files paperwork as one single entity.

Q Why am I required to join a chapter in addition to my regular CVMA membership?

A Prior to the chapter structure, you were already assigned to your local district, designated geographically; the new chapter structure formally recognizes that designation. CVMA and your local chapter provide complementary but different benefits. This requirement provides you with a more complete support system than in the past.

In addition, having one, unified professional association makes the veterinary profession's voice in Colorado stronger to influence legislators and regulators for the benefit of animal health and welfare, the public, and the profession.

Q How are chapter dues determined?

A Each chapter of CVMA sets its own membership fee. Dues may vary from chapter to chapter based on the services and benefits provided by each. Q What do my chapter dues include?

A Offerings vary from chapter to chapter; not all chapters charge dues. If they do, your chapter dues may help your chapter hold local gatherings, CE events (often free or discounted), local programs, and more. Q Where do I find information on my chapter's upcoming events, news, and information?

A Each chapter has its own group page on the CVMA website. To access the page, simply visit colovma.org, hover over the "Sign In" button in the top right corner, click on "Chapters and Districts," and then click on the link for your chapter's page. Once you have paid your membership dues, you will be able to click on your chapter's page to view the events calendar, learn about local news and updates, and connect with colleagues in your chapter through the member forum.
